Volunteer Services Department Dress Code

When on duty as a volunteer, you are representing SSM Health and SSM Health Cardinal Glennon Children's Hospital. Like other professionals in our hospital, your appearance, as well as your attitude, make a lasting impression on the public.

Your volunteer uniform signifies to the staff, patient and visitors that you are an authorized and trained member of the SSM Health/SSM Health Cardinal Glennon staff. Your dress should be neat, clean, and in good repair. An SSM Health volunteer vest will be given at orientation. the vest or t-shirt may be worn together or individually, but at least one of these two items along with badge must be worn at all times while volunteering.

- 1. Shoes should be clean and low-heeled. Tennie shoes are allowed. No sandals or opentoe shoes.
- 2. A CGCH Volunteer badge is provided and must be worn at all times as part of your uniform.
- 3. Jewelry should be minimal and cannot hinder any hygiene or safety protocols. (Rings, dangling earrings)
- Ronald McDonald Family Room volunteers receive RMFR logo'd uniforms by RMHC.
 - Or any business casual top will be acceptable as well.

5. Not allowed:

- Shorts of any type
- Jeans
- Tights as pants
- Sleeveless shirts or crop tops
- Sandals, flip flops, or open-toe shoes
- Hats/baseball caps
- 6. Exceptions may be made for certain volunteer roles and in certain areas of the hospitals. These will be approved by the Volunteer Services Director, Administration and department or Unit.
